



Guest Speakers

David Trim, Ph.D.



David Trim, Ph.D. is the Director of Archives, Statistics, and Research for the General Conference of Seventh-

day Adventists. He was born to missionary parents in Bombay (as it was then called), India, raised in Sydney, Australia, and educated in England. His BA cum laude is from Newbold College and his Ph.D. is from King's College, University of London. For 10 years, he taught at his alma mater, Newbold College. He taught undergraduate courses in history, general humanities, and religion, and postgraduate courses in hermeneutics and missiology. He then held the Walter C. Utt Chair in History at Pacific Union College in California for two years. He was elected to his current position. serving the world Church, at Annual Council 2010.

Trim is the only Seventh-day Adventist scholar to be elected a Fellow of the Royal Historical Society. He has held several visiting fellowships at universities in the UK, USA, and the Netherlands, including the University of California at Berkeley. Since 2014, he has been a Professor of Church History and Mission at the Seventh-day Adventist Theological Seminary at Andrews University.

He is the author, co-author, and editor of thirteen books, including "A Living Sacrifice: Unsung Heroes of Adventist Mission" (Pacific Press, 2019) and "The Huguenots: History and Memory in Transnational Context. Essays in Honor and Memory of Walter C. Utt" (Brill, 2011). In addition, he has published many book chapters and articles for both scholarly and general church readers. He is married to Wendy, a native of California; they have one adult daughter, Eve, who lives in Berlin, Germany.

Marlene Rodriguez, '05



Pastor Marlene Rodriguez was born in San Salvador, El Salvador but immigrated to the United States at an early age and grew

up in the San Francisco Bay Area with her two sisters and one brother. Her parents were committed to their children receiving an Adventist Christian education, though with limited means, it was certainly a challenge. Rodriguez and her siblings attended and graduated from San Francisco Junior Academy as well as

Monterey Bay Academy. Rodriguez later would receive her Bachelor of Arts degree in Spanish and International Communication from Pacific Union College.

Rodriguez has worked in a variety of settings and roles, including translating/interpreting for the Seventh-day Adventist Church in Spain, as an outreach worker for a free clinic focusing on issues of AIDS and HIV, and as a U.S. citizenship outreach coordinator helping immigrant families. She has also worked as a social worker case manager, working with over 50 families at a local community center, and as a marketing coordinator for a boot company, to name just a few. These employment experiences have given her a great appreciation of service and what it means to care for people.

In 2009, Rodriguez felt called to continue her education by enrolling in the Master of Divinity program at San Francisco Theological Seminary in order to pursue a career in chaplain ministries. She graduated with her masters in 2012 and subsequently completed four units of Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) after a one-year resident internship. During this time, she felt God moving on her heart to explore pastoral ministry in a local church context. In 2013, she received the opportunity to serve as a volunteer pastor at the Pleasant Hill SDA Church, working under the supervision of Jim Lorenz, the current Ministerial Director for the Northern California Conference of Seventh-day Adventists. In 2017,

Rodriguez felt God telling her to become a member and volunteer at the Concord International SDA Church, where she served as an Associate Pastor alongside her husband, and the lead Pastor, Pedro Trinidad.

Rodriguez is married to her best friend, Marc Woodson, an ordained minister who currently serves as President of the Northern California Conference of Seventhday Adventists. Together they are raising "Tahoe"- their lovable Bernese Mountain Dog.

HONORED ALUMNI

Ed & Barbara (Truitt) Holm | Biography 2021 Honored Alumni Award

Ed and Barbara Holm have a passion for service and a love for God that is evident to others wherever they go.

Ed was only 11-years-old when he met the then eight-year-old Barbara Truitt. Their fathers had been in the same medical school class and became doctors serving in the mission field with their families in tow. His family lived in Indonesia, and

her family lived in Thailand. When the two families crossed paths in Bali, Ed and Barbara met for the first time. Little did they know, they wouldn't reconnect until years later at Pacific Union College for their freshman year.

Interested in the sciences, Ed double majored in Biology and Chemistry. Barbara enrolled in the pre-nursing program, ready to pursue a career centered around caring for others. They ended up getting married, and their shared roots in mission work guided their steps to Guam, where Ed practiced internal medicine and pediatrics at the Guam Adventist Clinic. Together they have a son and daughter. Their son was only a one-year-old when they moved to Guam, and their daughter was born there.

After many years of traveling the globe, sharing their love for Jesus, and caring for the sick, Ed and Barbara returned to California to do more of the same. Ed has practiced internal medicine for over 40 years, and Barbara has served as a school nurse and as a licensed nurse practitioner for 25 years. Ed and Barbara now reside in Turlock, California, where they enjoy the warm sunshine, a beautiful yard, and an active community of church friends and family.

Ray & Lynette (Christensen) Holm | Biography 2021 Honored Alumni Award

Ray and Lynette Holm's love of missionary work, travel opportunities, and each other have guided them on a life of adventure together.

Ray was born in Indonesia, where his family was living at the time as missionaries. He spent the first 11 years of his life there and knew he wanted to continue leading a life of service around the world. Lynette grew up on a farm in Minnesota and imagined traveling as a missionary after her hometown's church pastor shared fascinating stories of his family's three years in Peru.

Both Ray and Lynette attended Pacific Union College and met while working in the school cafeteria, whipping fresh cream and baking almond tortes. Ray was studying Business Administration, and Lynette was a two-year nursing student. They were married in 1969 at the PUC church in a double wedding with Lynette's sister and Ray's college roommate. They spent their honeymoon as student missionaries on their first assignment in Ethiopia. Five years later, they returned to Ethiopian Adventist College with their two children and spent six years there as full-time missionaries. This was the beginning of a lifetime in the mission field. Ray and Lynette have visited 45 different countries together.

They live in Happy Valley, Oregon, and have joined organizations like Adventist Health and Maranatha in local and international mission work. They often think of how their time at PUC brought them together and set them on a path they had both dreamt of early on in life.


